Taking precautions

What supplies should you have at home to last you at least two weeks?

Plan as if you're going on a 14-day camping holiday:

- Water: an emergency supply of two litres of liquid per day and head
- **Food**: non-perishable foods such as jars/preserves (fruit and vegetables), cereals and legumes, pasta, rice, crisp bread, sugar, long-life milk
- **Cash** (enough for two weekly shops in small notes and coins stored in a safe place!)
- Medicine: Home medicine cabinet and essential personal medications (such as insulin)
- First aid kit
- Sanitary products
- Candles, matches
- **Radio** (battery or solar powered) or wind-up radio
- Spare batteries
- Camping stove, fuel paste
- Full tank of petrol in the car
- Pet supplies, if necessary (water, food)
- **Wood** for heating/fireplace where appropriate, sleeping bags, blankets and warm clothing

Do not use open flames in enclosed spaces - risk of fire and suffocation/poisoning!

What is a blackout?

A blackout is a prolonged power, infrastructure and supply failure, usually not just in your immediate region. Regional outages can often be resolved within hours, but it can take several days in the case of an outage that affects a larger area. This is to be distinguished from temporary technical disruptions (10 to 15 minutes) to the power supply.

How do I know it's a blackout?

- Is the power supply only interrupted in my home or are my surroundings (neighbourhood, street lamps) also affected?
- Are telephone, radio and internet still working?

Public warning systems

Mobile MoWaS warning system: Sends information and alerts from government authorities to various apps (such as NINA).

How/Where do I get up-to-date information?

- NINA warning app (only if you can get a mobile data signal)
- Cell Broadcast is being tested (only if mobile phone network is working)
- Radio (battery or solar powered)
- Car radio
- (Mobile) loudspeaker announcements
- City halls / Notice boards in central locations •


